Celebrating 10 Years of Service: Ballarat Community Health at Lucas

Ballarat Community Health (BCH) is thrilled to celebrate a significant milestone – 10 years of dedicated service and operation from their flagship site in Lucas. Located at 12 Lilburne Street, Lucas, this building has been a cornerstone of healthcare in the western region of Ballarat, serving tens of thousands of clients over the past decade.

The Lucas site has not only been essential to BCH's operations but has also become a major healthcare provider and a vital part of the community. In June 2012 a proposal to build a new site in the west of Ballarat was pitched with the idea being it would be in the western growth corridor ... this is a few months before the government had released the plans for the western growth corridor growth area, another 50,000 increase in population and staged planning. The site in Lucas was green and at the start of the growth area, and from a transport perspective, it was right on the edge of the proposed ring road as well as having the significance of being on the Avenue of Honour. These factors along with endless more came to an 800-page due diligence report on why BCH purchased the block of land.

The Lucas project is a testament to the enduring presence of Ballarat Community Health which has been on the community for 43 years. Architects were selected from a competitive field and Melbourne firm DesignInc. was the successful tenderer. This state-of-the-art building incorporates environmental and health promoting features such as recycled materials, natural light, climate control, open space, and indoor plants to add to the aesthetics and low carbon footprint. The ground floor includes a welcoming reception area, gymnasium, café, community kitchen, child play space, multipurpose event and meeting room plus plenty of private rooms for consultations.







In July 2013 local Ballarat firm Nicholson
Construction was selected as the preferred builder
for it's environmental capabilities, use of local
materials and costings. When the building was
completed, 93 percent of the trades, supplies and
materials were from Ballarat or the region. Only
specialist items such as lifts not available in
Australia came from overseas. By June 2014, The
Lucas building was ready to be opened – an
incredible achievement to have these works
completed in under a year. The official opening took
place on 23rd July 2014 with more than 500 invited
guests and visitors.

Lucas is now the flagship site of Ballarat Community Health with 5 other locations in Ballarat being, Howitt St Wendouree, Cooinda Wendouree, Vickers St Sebastopol, Victoria St Bakery Hill and Headspace Ballarat. The design and quality of the building were more broadly recognised in 2015 winning the Victorian Architecture Awards: Regional Prize for the Best Regional Building, and Nicholson Construction was awarded Regional Commercial Builder of the Year for their work.

Fast forward 10 years and Ballarat Community Health now see 530 clients every day across its sites with over 130,000 service events in the past 12 months. Doors are open to everyone in the community.

To commemorate this special occasion, BCH will host a celebratory afternoon tea later in the year. BCH extends a warm invitation to all Lucas residents and the greater community to join them in this celebration with information to come via their social channels over the coming weeks.

This event will offer an opportunity to look back on the key milestones and achievements of the past 10 years as well as see their state-of-the-art building and facilities mentioned. BCH will also share their vision for the future, outlining upcoming initiatives designed to continue improving the health and wellbeing of those not only living in Lucas but the entire Ballarat community.



50,000 Sandwiches Delivered

As always, Alfredton Rotary members have continued to work together to make a difference in our community.

Our Eatup Sandwich program reached a new milestone in May. We have now delivered over 50,000 sandwiches to local Primary Schools! Each fortnight, Year 7 & 8 students from Ballarat Grammar volunteer after school to make around 450 cheese sandwiches. These are delivered to 35 local and district schools where the staff freeze them ready for distribution when kids don't have any lunch.

We are really proud of this program, which we have been running since 2017 and couldn't do this without the support we have had from Eatup Australia, Woolworths who donate the bread, sponsorship each year from Nature's Cargo, the volunteers at Ballarat Grammar, other community volunteers and various grants.

Unfortunately, we are faced with increasing demand for sandwiches as many families struggle to make ends meet, so we would welcome any financial support that our local community may provide to assist us with this vital program. Please contact us on alfredtonrotary@hotmail.com if you can assist.

In addition to Eatup, we have just combined with two other local Rotary Clubs (Ballarat West and Wendouree Breakfast) to host the University of Newcastle's Science & Engineering Challenge (SEC) at Federation University. The SEC pits teams of secondary students against each other to solve a number of scientific or engineering problems.

It sounds daunting, but all of the activities are hands-on applications of science or engineering principles, like bridge building, creating structures that will withstand earthquakes, working out the most effective way to connect various towns and utilities or creating robotic hands using straws and rubber bands!

A really interesting and different way for students in Yrs 10 and 9 to immerse themselves in STEM. Again we are extremely grateful to our sponsors, Federation University, Mercure Ballarat, The Rotary Community Op Shop, MKR Pro Engineering, Service Stream, Plinius Engineering, Integra, Gestalt Engineers, Bartletts, GTE Technology and Gekko Systems, all of who's support enabled us to fund the day free of charge to the participating schools.

From 'Wastamal' to 'The Safe Rhythm', these are some Crazy Good Ideas

On May 30th and 31st, 65 young people from Loreto College, Damascus College, and Mount Rowan Secondary College came together for a two-day Social Innovators program facilitated by Crazy Ideas College (CIC), hosted by Ballarat Tech School and enabled by Integra, Ballarat Isuzu, Ballarat Foundation, and Brophy Family & Youth Services.

On Day 1, students selected a passion topic related to various environmental and societal issues and formed teams with like-minded peers around these. Together, they brainstormed and developed crazy good ideas and finished the day building a prototype of their favourite big idea, which was carried forward. With a sense of pride about the progress made and some weary heads, there was a real buzz of excitement and anticipation of what tomorrow would bring.





Day 2 progressed swiftly as teams focused on creating achievable experiments to test their big ideas. Excitement filled the air as teams prepared to pitch their issue, big idea, and experiment to a panel of 14 community partners. The energy and dedication of the students was evident as they eagerly presented their projects, showcasing their passion and commitment to making a difference. As the partners shared what they loved about each idea and who in the community may be able to assist them in bringing it to life. Story continued over page.

The community partners included David Sanders from the Rotary Club, Domenic Commisso and Brydie Hamilton from Ballarat Isuzu, Inga Hamilton from Sustainability Victoria, Liam Gibcus, Marcos Chi and Owen Kew from Integra, Ricci Shepherd from the Ballarat Foundation, Alex, Tameaka and Sam from Ballarat Community Health, Michaela Beggs from Commerce Ballarat, and Michael Poulton from Committe 4 Ballarat.

The students' ideas ranged from "Wastamal," an innovative animal that consumes waste and transforms it into useful items for the community, to "The Safe Rhythm," a revolutionary jacket designed to uplift and support individuals with heart issues and communication challenges, particularly neurodivergent people.

The students received overwhelmingly positive feedback from the partners, with many teams being offered support and guidance in taking their Smart Start Experiment to the next stage of development.

CIC believes in providing opportunities for young people to explore their agency, creativity, and thinking in safe, collaborative spaces. The Ballarat Social Innovators Program certainly showed young people at their best, leaning into new possibilities, working with others to showcase their own and their peers' strengths, and thinking critically about big issues that matter. A Tragic August Tale from our Avenue of Honour

As Blanche Caley was sending her three sons off to the Black Hill State School each day, she had no idea of the torment that lay ahead of her. Her boys each volunteered to serve in WW1, Charles with the Light Horse, Thomas with the Australian Flying Corps and Henry with the Infantry. Henry was first to enlist in April 1915, and in mid-June he embarked for Egypt. Blanche received a card from him dated August 5th, in which he advised he was approaching Gallipoli as a reinforcement for the 14th Battalion. She subsequently learned that he was listed as absent without leave, in Egypt, from July 30th 1915, and it appeared he had abandoned his mates and avoided service at Gallipoli. Blanche heard nothing further from him and was emotionally torn between the belief that Henry was a shirker and the thought he was still alive and might make contact with her.

In February 1919, after the war, Henry was officially deemed to be an illegal absentee and was dishonourably discharged from the AIF. Around this time, prompted by a letter from one of Henry's mates, Blanche wrote to the Secretary of Defence, seeking further information. In late 1921 a formal enquiry was undertaken, and evidence was taken from several men who had been with Henry in Egypt. Three of the witnesses reported having spoken with Henry Caley on Gallipoli on August 6th, and further evidence revealed that the 14th Battalion 'had the misfortune to lose all its records covering the first few months of the campaign'. The Enquiry concluded that Caley was with his battalion at Gallipoli on August 6th, and in January 1922, more than six years after receiving Henry's card, Blanche was formally advised he 'has now been adjudged to have been killed in action on 6-7/8/1915'. Henry Caley's reputation, and his mother's pride, had been restored.

Blanche had endured six years of anguish, embarrassment, uncertainty and grief, with the single bright spot being that her other sons, Charles and Thomas, returned safely within a week of each other in July 1919.

In 1923 Blanche received Henry's Memorial Plaque and Scroll, and he is commemorated on the Australian War Memorial Roll of Honour, at tree 632 in the Ballarat Avenue of Honour and on the Black Hill State School Honour Board. His name was added as an addendum to the Australian National Memorial at Lone Pine, Gallipoli.
