At the recent meeting and AGM of the Lucas Community Garden Group, our President Matt Rowbottom has advised he will be stepping down. Matt's friendly nature, enthusiasm and leadership skill has been the key stabilizing force in maintaining the Garden and its team of volunteers through a rebirth and a significant change period over the last 3-4 years, Matt's leadership will be missed by all and we take this opportunity to say thank you.

Peter Skinner has stepped into the role of President supported by David Sanders as Assistant President, Leearne Sidebottom as Secretary and Matt Rowbottom pleasingly staying on in an advisory role. These positions have been filled in accordance with the requirements associated with being an incorporated registered body.

The garden is now situated in its new location, sitting on a granitic-sand base with a water supply. The site preparation work, water and garden layout was undertaken, by the City of Ballarat Council, in consultation with Matt and the team through the Community Development Officer Natalie Grero.

Our sincere thanks to all involved, an excellent outcome. A more recent project has been the placement of our "Share Cupboard" on a shelf attached to the western end of our Community Garden's Equipment Storage Container. The purpose of this cupboard is to promote sharing of harvested vegetables (from the garden or home gardens) that exceed immediate need and would otherwise go to waste.

We encourage all to make use of this initiative either to collect or deposit food that can be used by others. The Garden is currently in its autumn replant phase, with most beds planted with either seed (now emerging) or seedling plants. It should be noted that the majority of seedlings and the necessary fertilizers have been donated by Bunnings Ballarat or members of our team.

The garden would struggle without these generous donations, we say thank you to all who have donated and also to those members of our team who make their time available to provide regular watering (small seedlings are very vulnerable and will fail if the soil becomes dry).

# Bush Kinder at Lucas Kindergarten: Connecting with Country through nature play

At Y Kinders' Lucas Kindergarten, nature is not just a backdrop, it is a powerful teacher. Through nature-based programs, including regular visits to the Lucas Community Garden and the Mullawallah Wetlands for Bush Kinder, the kinder embraces outdoor learning as an essential part of early education.

Bush Kinder is a much-loved and vital experience for the two kinder groups.

"In just about every weather - rain or shine, we head out to the wetlands where nature becomes our classroom. We take no toys or play equipment — because the environment provides all the resources we need. The possibilities are endless!" said Rebecca Borrelli, teacher at Lucas Kindergarten.

"Children climb over fallen branches, balance on uneven ground, observe the shifting water levels, and marvel at seasonal changes. They spot black swans gliding across the water, hear the laughter of kookaburras, and listen intently for magpies and other birds.

We are so fortunate to have such amazing and rich resources right in the Lucas community," she added. These immersive experiences awaken children's senses and imaginations. Familiar trees take on new identities - the "spaghetti tree" and the "imagination tree" providing inspiration for a fairy playground, or even a boat in a water world. It's unstructured play at its best—fostering creativity, resilience, and connection to the environment.



At the heart of the Bush Kinder program is a commitment to embedding Indigenous perspectives, with a concrete way for children to connect with the land in meaningful ways. Gathering on Wadawurrung Country, the children acknowledge the Traditional Owners each session. They physically touch Country, forming deep, respectful connections, and gain a real-world understanding of what it means to care for their environment.

Rebecca enthusiastically added, "Being in the natural environment at Bush Kinder also nurtures everyone's wellbeing and its benefits are felt by us all. There's a calming power in fresh air and connecting with the earth. For children and educators alike, it's a chance to reset, recharge, enjoy nature and have fun!"

# Lucas Local: Nick Beale

Twenty-one years ago, Nick Beale moved from South Africa to Australia, calling Sydney and Melbourne home before settling in Ballarat. ## Recently Completed: Halligan Street in Lucas Stage A

John Halligan - 2nd Lieutenant - 59th Battalion

John Halligan (SN 1355/Lt.) was born in Ballarat and educated at the Urquhart Street State School. He was a 19 year old salesman when he enlisted on October 26th 1914. He left Australia from Melbourne aboard the Clan Macgillivray in February 1915 and served at Gallipoli with the 7th Battalion. He received a bullet wound to his arm in May and was sent to a military hospital on Malta for recovery.

After Gallipoli, as a commissioned officer, he was transferred to the 59th Battalion and moved to France. In October 1916, he received a gun shot wound to the left of his face, which resulted in the loss of 5 teeth and sent to the 3rd London Hospital for treatment. He rejoined his unit in February 1917. On May 31st 1917 he died of wounds following the accidental detonation of a grenade. He is buried in the Dernancourt Communal Cemetery, France. He was 21 years of age. His Uncle Percy Chalmers also served in the AIF and is honoured with a tree in the Avenue.

Lucas was named after the 'Lucas Girls' who played such a vital role in creating two of Ballarat's most distinguished historical landmarks.

All of the streets in Lucas are named after Soldiers who fought in World War I and who are remembered in the Avenue of Honour.

Graham's Story: How volunteering with L2P changes lives.

For Graham May, becoming a volunteer mentor with the Ballarat Foundation's L2P Program has been one of the most rewarding decisions of his life.

Three and a half years ago, Graham first heard about the program during a footy match on television. At the time, he was exploring different volunteering options and wanted something that offered flexibility, connection with young people and the chance to make a real difference. L2P ticked all the boxes.

"I chose this program because it gave me the opportunity to be flexible with my commitment while engaging with younger people and helping them to become safe, confident drivers," Graham said. "It was a way to hopefully help reduce the road toll as well."

Since then, Graham has mentored six young learner drivers, helping three of them successfully achieve their provisional licences. Every learner in Victoria is required to complete 120 hours of supervised driving before sitting their driving test. Mentors like Graham are not professional instructors, but they play a vital role in developing young drivers' skills, building their confidence and setting them on the path to safe and independent driving.

Importantly, L2P also gives young participants the chance to connect with positive role models, boosting their confidence both behind the wheel and in life more broadly.

One of Graham's proudest moments came recently when his student driver Amee earned her provisional licence. When Amee joined the program, she had just 30 hours of driving experience. Over the next eight months, she and Graham clocked up more than 80 hours together on the road.

Reflecting on her experience, Amee said: "When I joined L2P I was expecting a full-on driving school with instructors and strict instructions, but after meeting with Graham I realised that it wasn't what I had expected. It was very laid back and you were just able to chat while doing your drive, with only some instructions and where to go. You would just organise a time and meeting place then go out for an hour or so and just drive around."

Achieving her P-plates has opened up new opportunities, offering freedom, independence and a stronger connection to her community.

"Now that I have my P's it's really freeing and honestly a little scary to know that I can drive around by myself. But it's great not having to resort to public transport or your parents to drive you places," she said.

Graham's story is a wonderful example of the impact one person can have when they choose to volunteer. Through patience, encouragement and simple acts of support, mentors like Graham are helping young people find their independence and move confidently into adulthood.



In February of this year, UFS Medical took up residency in the building, opening their fourth medical centre in the Ballarat region. Best known for their network of local pharmacies dating back to 1881, UFS now operates 19 pharmacies, four medical centres, an Urgent Care Clinic and an optometry service, with even more growth plans for 2025!

As well as a sparkling new, purpose-built facility, the Lucas UFS Medical Centre is home to four GPs, an on-site nurse, a sessional audiologist and a full-time remedial massage therapist.

We all know that choosing a new GP or allied health professional can be a challenge. Afterall, it's a big decision. It's important to feel at ease and to trust their expertise to ensure you're receiving the best care possible.

We thought it would be great to learn a little more about some of the Lucas UFS Medical team with a 10-minute Q & A.



# GP Dr. Viraj Rajaguru

# At what age did you decide you wanted to become a doctor?

During my secondary school years, I was always fascinated by science and the complexity of the human body. What truly inspired me further was witnessing doctors saving lives and making a real difference in people's health and wellbeing.

# What influenced you to become a doctor, and more specifically a General Practitioner?

My decision to become a doctor was influenced by a strong interest in science and a genuine desire to work closely with people—helping to treat their illnesses and support both their physical and mental wellbeing. Over time, I was particularly drawn to the role of a General Practitioner because it offers a holistic approach to care, continuity, and the opportunity to build long-term relationships with patients. As a GP, I have the privilege of managing a wide range of health issues—from prevention to diagnosis and treatment. I find it incredibly fulfilling to be the first point of contact in someone's healthcare journey. The GP role demands both clinical expertise and compassion, and it's that balance that I truly value.

#### What is a career highlight for you?

One of the most memorable moments in my career was when I successfully diagnosed a condition that had been overlooked for quite some time. The patient had seen several healthcare providers, but their symptoms remained unresolved. By taking a systematic approach—listening carefully, conducting a thorough examination, and ensuring proper follow-up-I was able to identify the root cause and refer them for the appropriate treatment. Seeing the patient recover and express such gratitude was a powerful reminder of the value of being diligent, compassionate, and persistent. Experiences like that reaffirm why I chose this profession and continue to inspire me everyday.

# What do you find most challenging about your role?

One of the most challenging aspects of being a General Practitioner is managing time effectively while ensuring each patient receives the attention and care they deserve. With the growing demands, complex



cases, and administrative tasks, balancing everything in a single day can be tough. However, I view this challenge as an opportunity to improve my efficiency, prioritise tasks, and maximise the quality of each patient interaction. It also highlights the importance of teamwork and clear communication within the practice to maintain high-quality, patient-centred care.

# What is the best piece of advice you can offer people about taking care of their health?

The best advice I can offer is to listen to your body, stay on top of regular check-ups, and make small, consistent lifestyle choices - such as staying active, eating a balanced diet, managing stress, and ensuring adequate rest. Prevention is truly better than cure, and even simple habits can have a significant impact over time. Also, if something doesn't feel right, don't hesitate to consult your doctor - early intervention can make a world of difference.

# Outside of your role as a GP, what keeps you busy?

Outside of my work as a GP, I love spending quality time with my kids and family. Activities like cycling, gardening, and walking help me unwind and maintain balance. I also have a strong passion for continuous learning, teaching junior doctors, attending workshops to stay up to date. Maintaining a healthy work-life balance is important to me, as it allows me to bring my best self to both my patients and my personal life.

# What benefits can people expect from remedial massage?




#### Outside of work, what makes you happy?

We have also combined with the other Rotary Clubs to create the Community Care Centre Ballarat. This is basically a warehouse of donated household items that are provided to people in need.

Working with agencies such as Uniting, Anglicare, WRISC etc we provide a list of furniture or household goods that their clients can select from, then they come to the warehouse to choose which beds, lounge suite, saucepans, dining table, glassware, or whatever it is they need, from the stock on hand. Volunteers are always needed to collect, sort and itemise donations.

That's what we've been up to locally, but globally we have also been busy. We collected donated school furniture, from Sienna Catholic PS and other schools, plus books, sewing machines, beds, medical equipment and aids, hospital linen and scrubs, beds, toys, craft supplies and other items from a wide array of individuals, businesses and organisations. This all went into a container which was sent to Vanuatu to assist the hospital, schools and community there.

A group of 17 Rotarians, friends and family members, including one Ballarat South Rotary member, recently travelled to Vanuatu to paint the Children's Outpatients Ward and examination rooms. The group worked extremely hard and well together to transform the spaces and refresh the whole area. While in Vanuatu the group also had time to do some sightseeing, learn about the local traditions and relax in the warm weather.

The trip was a perfect example of how Rotary brings people together to assist others while having a great time.

# A word from Martha Haylett

Lucas continues to grow, with new homes popping up across the suburb every few weeks.

It is such a great community to be a part of, but we need to make sure local services keep pace with the growth.

Last year, hundreds of locals contacted me about getting a bus connection to the area for the first time. Over 400 residents signed a petition, which I presented to the Minister for Public Transport on behalf of our community.



Many readers will know that our advocacy paid off with a new Lucas 10 bus route beginning from February this year. It now connects Lucas families to the heart of Ballarat – making it easier to access jobs, medical appointments, shops, and train services.

I am eager for the bus connection to be spread across the suburb more in future, with more stops. The State Labor Government has just announced a review of Ballarat's bus network, with opportunities for locals to have their say soon. I strongly encourage all readers to get involved in the review so we can make sure we get even better bus connections in future.

In other positive news – the Lucas Community Hub Expansion is now complete.

It looks incredible and includes a new kindergarten room and outdoor space for 33 more kids. There are new spaces for staff, a new laundry, and foyer area too. The \$1.5 million project was made possible with funding from the State Labor Government and City of Ballarat. For any families who haven't checked it out – the Early Parenting Centre in Lucas is also now open and has recently marked its first birthday.

I visited the centre with my newborn son, Liam, late last year and I cannot recommend it enough. There are different activities for new parents and bubs, as well as support with sleep, settling, feeding, and adjusting to parenthood.

Lastly – many local parents have contacted me about the lack of safe school crossings around Siena Primary School and Lucas Primary School. I am working closely with both schools and the City of Ballarat to advocate for funds to fix this. I'll be sure to keep readers updated about this important issue.
